



Built Up and Grown Up

Ephesians 4:11-16

¹¹ So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, ¹² to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up ¹³ until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

Ephesians 4:11-16

14 Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming.

Ephesians 4:11-16

15 Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. 16 From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.

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It is God's desire that a church, made up of brothers and sisters in Christ, is not a random collection of building materials, but a functional, and welcoming, structure—a home.

“Brothers and sisters, I could not address you as people who live by the Spirit but as people who are still worldly—mere infants in Christ. I gave you milk, not solid food, for you were not yet ready for it. Indeed, you are still not ready. You are still worldly.”

(1 Corinthians 3:1-3)

It is God's desire that followers of Jesus not be "tossed around" easily—swept away and fooled by enticing new ideas and influences—but mature and grounded in the truth and love of Christ.

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EPHESIANS 4:11-12



This is a team-focused approach to leadership.

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The team has a single goal: Equipping God's people—all of them, every "part" of the body—for works of service.

1 Corinthians 12:12-20

12 Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ... 15 Now if the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body.


1 Corinthians 12:12-20

16 And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. **17** If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be?

1 Corinthians 12:12-20

18 But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. **19** If they were all one part, where would the body be? **20** As it is, there are many parts, but one body.

What are the best pathways to individual growth?

“The findings discovered that most people didn’t need elaborate programs or pre-engineered activities to grow in their love of God and others. And it wasn’t sermons, spectacular Sunday services, or comfortable buildings that grew their faith either.”

“Instead, the researchers found that what aided a person’s growth most were: 1) personal Bible reading, 2) prayer and meditation, 3) a meaningful relationship with a friend or mentor, and 4) regularly serving others.”
